





Types of Contracts

Contract	Purpose
Works	Contract for construction of engineering structures such as roads, bridges and dams. Unit price or lump sum contract may be used depending on whether input requirements are known with precision.
Supply	Contract for supply and delivery of equipment or materials to specified location. Scope may include provision of related services such as installation, testing, commissioning and training.
Design-Supply- Install (Turnkey)	Single contract provides engineering design, supply of equipment, construction, testing and commissioning of complete facility to meet specified performance targets.

Drivers of strong performance:

- Appoint a good team leader.
- Establish good relationships with EA
- Coordinate relationships between International and National consultants
- Timely deliver expected outputs
- Manage replacements of experts



Avoid Common Mistakes

- Failure to disclose conflict of interest
- Firm or any of its associates not incorporated in an ADB member country
- Proposal / Bid was not delivered on time
- Employees from executing agencies included in consultant's proposal
- Contractors are connected with executing agencies
- Submission of fake documents to substantiate experience, financial resources, power of attorney
